Day 1 Kingston June 23

Discover more of Ontario as we travel east along the 401, officially known as the Macdonald–Cartier Freeway. We'll exit the 401 and travel the historic Loyalist parkway through scenic Prince Edward County, an island on the north shore of Lake Ontario. The County is quickly becoming a top culinary and winery destination as well as the newest community to establish Barn Quilt Trail, a network of rural art. Enjoy a tour and tasting at one of local wineries. Prior to boarding the Glenora Ferry for the short trip across the Bay of Quinte, we stop at Lake on the Mountain, one of Ontario's natural wonders. Our journey continues along the shore of Lake Ontario to the historic city of Kingston. Welcome Dinner this evening. (D)

Day 2 Montreal June 24

After breakfast a local guide will highlight the sights and sounds of Kingston. See Old Fort Henry and hear the importance this historic site held for the city. See the Military College, the City Hall, the old Kingston Penitentiary, the John A Macdonald house and more. Later we travel along the shore highway to the community of Gananoque, Gateway to the 1000 Islands. Here we set out on a one hour cruise that takes you closer than any other cruise available in the 1000 Islands. See fifth and sixth generation family cottages and cruise the narrow channels of the Admiralty and Navy group of islands. A light lunch will be served on boarding. On return to shore, we continue our travels to the cosmopolitan city of Montreal. (B,L)

Day 3 Montreal June 25

This morning we are joined by an English speaking guide for a tour of the Old and the New of Montreal. Get a fantastic view over the city from the top of Mont Royal and see St. Josephs Oratory, Canada's largest church and claims to have one of the largest domes in the world. You'll be in awe of the intricate interior on a guided tour of Notre Dame Basilica. After the tour, enjoy some free time to experience the sights and sounds along St. Catherine Street, one of the most famous streets in Montreal. (B)

Day 4 Ottawa June 26

Leaving Montreal, we turn our sights north to the Capital city of Ottawa. On arrival a local guide will highlight several of these on a guided city tour. See Parliament Hill, 24 Sussex Drive, Rideau Hall, diplomatic Embassy's, the National Art Gallery and so much more! We end the tour at the Rideau Mall and Byward Market for lunch on your own. At Canada's most visited museum, discover the events, experiences, people and objects that have shaped the nation's history. Take in the beauty of this architectural gem and its spectacular setting on the banks of the Ottawa River. Marvel at the world's largest indoor collection of totem poles and explore the traditions and achievements of Canada's First Peoples. Now opened, the [Canadian History Hall](#) presents Canada's story as you've never seen it before. We enjoy a group farewell dinner this evening. (B,D)
